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Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organization evolved as an instrument and an integrated platform, out of the Divine Will and grace of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba for redeeming humanity and in achieving their life's goal. It is a practical approach to the three spiritual paths enumerated in our scriptures viz., Devotion (Bhakthi), Knowledge (Jnana) and Service (Karma). The Organization which was established nearly five decades ago has been growing day by day and is to day recognized and respected the world over as a unique service Organization for its yeoman services and is progressing further at a great pace.

With the formation of a separate Telengana State, Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organizations formally came into being on the Guru Poornima day on the 27th of July 2018. It is indeed a rare privilege and honour to be appointed as the first Telengana State unit President of the Organization. I consider this as a sacred responsibility put on my shoulders and is only a proof of the unbounded grace of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba varu.

The Organization has been extending selfless services in 153 Samithis and 331 Bhajana Mandalis, spread over the 31 districts, throughout the state. The various activities mainly cater to the three wings of the establishment viz., Spiritual, Service and Education and include Devotional Singing(Bhajans), Street Singing(Nagara Sankeertans), Study Circles(Satsang), Light Meditation, Practice (Sadhana) Camps, Bala Vikas Programmes etc. These are being conducted by Women wing (Mahila Vibhags) and Youth (Yuvatha) of the Organization, on the lines of Bhagawan's Teachings, and employing methodologies in tune with modern times. Bhagawan had on once clarified that the letters in His name SAI reflects as follows:

S for Spiritual Change **A** for Association Change and **I** for Individual change.

Swami had also said on many occasions, that one of the purposes of His Avatarhood is to bring a transformation in these three aspects and to bring about a unity among them is His objective and philosophy. It is mainly to propagate this that He established this unique Organization, as His instrument and through this He intended man to realise His innate divinity and said that such realization is the true spiritual wisdom.

Swami had reiterated that the unity of these three is the real nature of Love and He trained us as true soldiers of service and introduced us into the Organization to render social service. Our lives have to get sanctified in this Unique Organization by rendering selfless service to fellow beings. This is what Bhagawan expects from us. Keeping the above as its goals, Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organization, Telengana has been conducting various spiritual and service programmes under the banner of "Sri Sathya Sai Village (Grama Seva) Maha Yagnam" and resolve to continue to move on and offer these services as a tender flower at the Lotus feet of our beloved Lord.

Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations



About the Organisation

Preamble

The Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, founded by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in the year 1965, is a service organisation with a spiritual core and base to benefit all mankind irrespective of religion, caste, creed or sect. The Organisation serves as a platform for its members to undertake service and other activities as their sadhana (spiritual discipline) which is motivated by an urge for self-transformation to realise one's inherent divinity.

Objectives

The following extracts from the discourses given by Sri Sathya Sai Baba proclaim the purpose of the organisation:

“You must have the firm belief that the aim of this Organisation is to remove the obstacles that keep man away from God, that separate maanavathwa (humanity) from Maadhavathwa (Divinity). There can be no human; it is all Divine. This Organisation must elevate the human into the Divine.”

“The main objective of the Sathya Sai Organisation, which you must always keep before you is to help man to recognise the Divinity that is inherent in him. But, this Divinity is latent; it is veiled; it is not always apparent to oneself or others.”

In a revealing discourse delivered on the 23rd of February 1968 in Prashanthi Nilayam, Sri Sathya Sai Baba clearly explained the purpose of the organisation. He said:

“The Organisations named after Me are not to be used for publicising My Name, or creating a new cult around My worship. They must try to spread interest in japam (recitation of God's Name), dhyaanam (meditation) and other saadhanas (spiritual practices), which lead man Godward; they must demonstrate the joy derivable from bhajan (devotional group singing) and Naamasmarana (remembering God's Name), the Shaanthi (peace) that one can draw from Sathsang (good company). They must render seva (service) to the helpless, the sick, the distressed, the illiterate and the needy. Their seva (selfless service) should not be exhibitionistic; it must seek no reward, not even gratitude or thanks from



the recipients. Seva is saadhana, not a pastime of the rich and well placed. Each one must realise his own truth. That is the purpose of all the teaching, all the curing, all the counselling, all the organising, all the advising that I do”

It is emphasised that the Sai Organisation is not a religious or a proselytising organisation. It has also not been established to preach any particular religion. At no point is an individual asked to follow a certain religion or rituals. On the contrary each is inspired to follow his own faith so as to ensure that a Hindu becomes a better Hindu, a Muslim becomes a better Muslim, a Christian becomes a better Christian and so on. In fact, this spiritual basis inspires everyone to pursue his own religion better by putting into practice Love and Selflessness. That is why the Organisation features in its emblem the symbols of the major religions of mankind.

Thus, without any distinction of religion, nationality, race, socio-economic status, either for those who work in the Organisation or for those who are served by it, the Organisation transcends all barriers leading humanity towards the ideal of **‘Fatherhood of God and Brotherhood of Man’**.





Membership Fees

There is no fee or subscription for membership. The concept of fees or membership subscription is alien to the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, for there cannot be any fee or subscription for one's journey towards his own Self.

Units of the Organisation

The organisation functions through its primary units called as Samithis and Bhajan Mandalis of which individuals - from different strata of society, different ethnic groups pursuing different religions and faiths - are members who are bound by the dictum of "Love all, Serve All" and pursue their own sadhana towards self-realisation following the path of selfless service to humanity. •



Sri Sathya Sai Baba on Organisation

“I have not got the slightest intention to utilise the Seva Samithis (Service Organisations) for propagating My Name or canvas homage for My Name. No! I am content only when spiritual endeavours and disciplines to elevate and purify man are progressing everywhere. It is only through these that My universal reality will be revealed. So, do not limit Me to the boundaries of any one name and form. Your aim should be to see the self-same God in

all the Forms that are worshipped, to picture Him in all the Names, nay, to be conscious of His presence as the inner motivator of every living being, in every particle of matter. Do not fall into the error of considering some to be men worthy of reverence and some unworthy. Sai is in every one; so, all deserve your reverence and service. Propagate this truth; that is the function I assign to the Seva Samithis.”

“You know that these organisations- Seva Samithis, Bhajana Mandalis, Seva Sanghams are for awakening in man the consciousness of the Divinity inherent in him and to encourage him to cultivate it, so that he could blossom into a real Saadhaka and then into a Saadhu (detached, devoted, virtuous, wise, aspirant), and finally into a Liberated Personality merged in the Supreme.”

“Sathya Sai Seva Samithis are built on love. They thrive on love; they spread love. No other emotion or attitude has any place therein. Divinity is the magnet; humanity is the iron. Love is the force that brings them together. Nara is the iron, Naaraayana is the magnet. Bhakthi or Love is the force that draws the two together. The a-shaanthi (peacelessness) from which man

suffers should disappear; man should attain prashaanthi (inner, deep-rooted peace); that is the aim of the institutions initiated by Me.”

“I must say plainly that ninety out of a hundred among you have not clearly visualised the purpose for which I have allowed you to form these Organisations. You are not engaged in social service through these organisations; you are engaged in your own service. All the items of work are aimed at expanding your heart and purifying it.”

“Society shapes the individual, provides the arena for his development and sets the ideals he should plant before himself. Sai has resolved to transform the individual and society by promoting this mutual regeneration, by the action of one on the other; hence, the formation of this Organisation, and the establishment of its Units in all countries, for the sublimation of the human into the Divine.”

Charter of the Organisation



Permanent Charter granted by **Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba** to the **Sri Sathya Sai Organisations**¹, at the **Third World Conference**, dated this 14th day of January in the 55th year of His Advent, Anno Domini 1981. **Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba**, out of His infinite Grace and Mercy sends blessings to all to whom this Permanent Charter shall be seen, showed, or read.

WHEREAS the Advent of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba as declared by HIM is for the establishment of Sanathana Dharma.

AND WHEREAS this World Organisation is a Spiritual Organisation founded for the whole Mankind, not recognising any distinction or separateness on the basis of religion, caste, colour, or creed,

AND WHEREAS this Organisation takes within its fold persons belonging to all religions in order to establish unity of all faiths,

AND WHEREAS the purpose of this Organisation is to establish and promote the content of such Sanathana Dharma and also to establish the Sai Teaching of Oneness (Unity) as the essence of all religions.

AND WHEREAS the most fundamental object of this Organisation as laid down by Bhagawan is to “Awaken in Man the awareness of the Divinity *INHERENT* in him” by propagating through practice and example the basic principles of sathya (truth), dharma (righteousness), shanti (peace), prema (love) and ahimsa (nonviolence) set by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba,



AND WHEREAS to experience this Divinity, mere environment and circumstances outside are not sufficient but a change in the minds of men is necessary,

AND WHEREAS the activities of the Organisation are only a means to the spiritual progress in this direction and which progress will ultimately enable everyone to enjoy inner peace notwithstanding the stresses and strains, the frustrations and sorrows, the defeats and successes, the ups and downs of life,

AND WHEREAS to achieve maximum results towards these objectives,

It Is Hereby Declared:

- A. That this shall be the Charter governing the Sathya Sai Organisations all over the world.
- B. That all the office bearers and members of this Organisation at present and all those who will join this Organisation

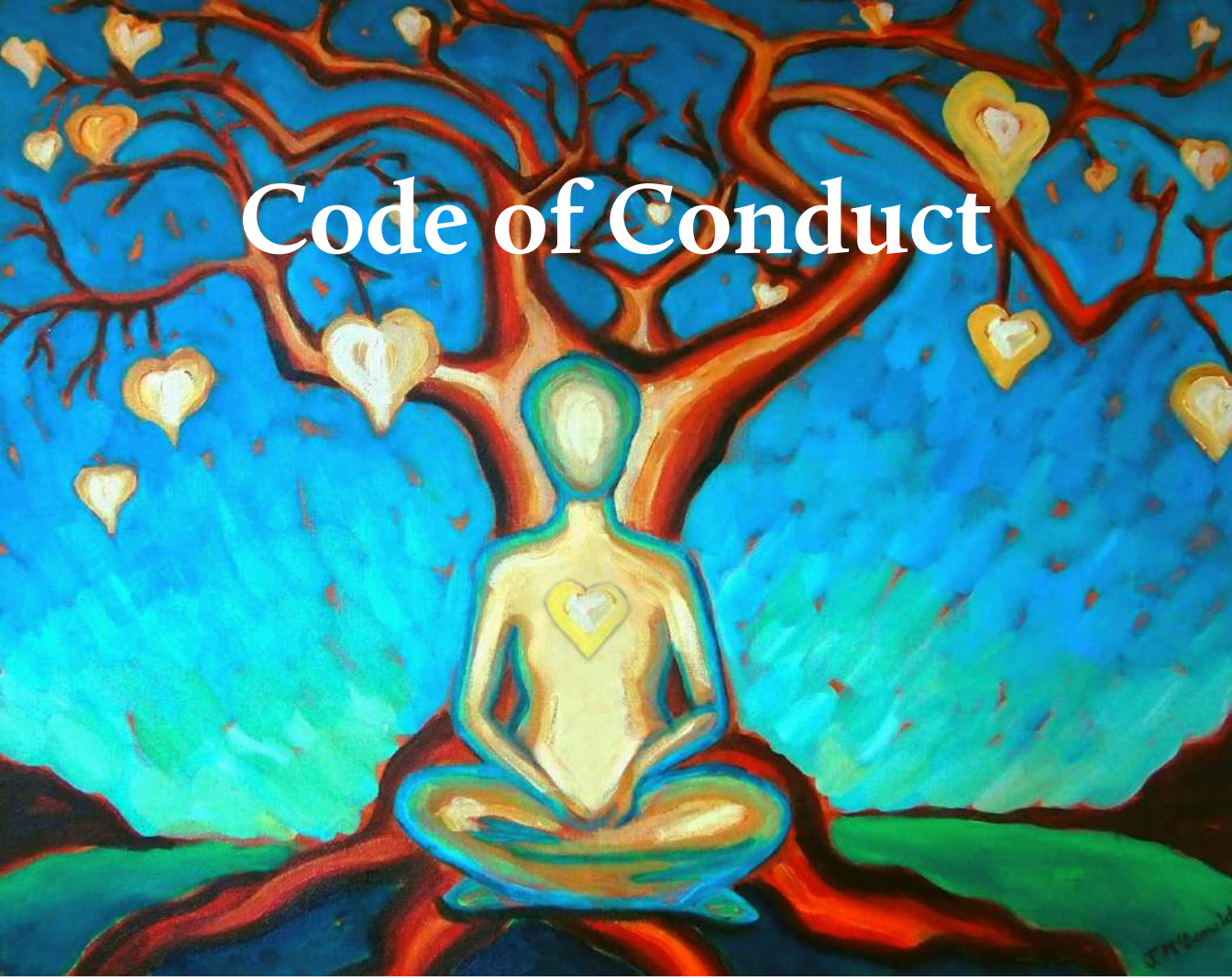
shall be one in Deed and in Name, by the name of Sri Sathya Sai Organisations, and as such, they shall be entitled to carry on the activities in the name of the Organisation.

- C. That in order to achieve the objectives as laid down hereinabove the members shall follow a strict Code of Conduct of sadhana (spiritual exercises) so that they become worthy instruments of our Bhagawan Baba in the efforts to fulfil the objectives of this Organisation.
- D. That no person shall be qualified to associate himself/herself as office bearer or worker with this Organisation who willfully deviates from the Code of Conduct laid down hereinafter. •

(The name of the organisation and all references to it, in India, shall for all purposes be read and known as Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations.)



Code of Conduct



Every member of the Organisation is expected to undertake sadhana (spiritual discipline) as an integral part of this daily life and abide by the following 9 point Code of Conduct which has been ordained by Sri Sathya Sai Baba for one's spiritual advancement:

1. Daily meditation and prayer.
2. Devotional singing/prayer with members of his family once per week.
3. Participation in the Bal Vikas programmes conducted by the Organisation for children.
4. Attendance at least once per month as group devotional programmes conducted by the Organisation.
5. Participation in community service and other programmes of the Organisation.
6. Regular study of Sai literature.
7. Putting into practice the principles of "ceiling on desires" and utilise any savings thereby generated for the service of mankind.
8. Speaking softly and lovingly with everyone with whom he comes into contact.
9. Not to indulge in talking ill of others especially in their absence. •





Ten Principles

In His discourse at the World Conference on 21 November 1985, Sathya Sai Baba gave the following ten principles to be followed by every member. He directed to follow these directives with enthusiasm and with love and be examples for others, wherever one is.

1. Love and Serve the Motherland; do not hate or hurt the motherland of others.
2. Honour every religion; each is pathway to the one God.
3. Love all men without distinction; know that mankind is a single community.
4. Keep your home and its environs clean; it will ensure health and happiness for you and for society.
5. Do not throw coins when beggars stretch their hands for alms; help them become self-reliant. Provide food and shelter, love and care, for the sick and the aged.
6. Do not tempt other by offering bribes or demean yourself by accepting bribes.
7. Do not develop jealousy, hatred or envy on any account.
8. Do not depend on other to serve your personal needs; become your own servant, before proceeding to serve others.
9. Adore God. Abhor Sin.
10. Observe the laws, rules and regulations laid down by the State and be ideal citizens. •

Core Principles of the Organisation

The organisation is founded on the following core principles:

1. There are no fees or subscription or any other charge by whatever name called for membership of the organisation.
2. Solicitation of funds, directly or indirectly, in any manner is strictly prohibited. The expenses of the day-to-day activities of the units of the Organisation are met by voluntary contribution by the members themselves. Under no circumstances a public appeal for solicitation of funds is resorted to for undertaking any activity of the organisation.

“The Sathya Sai Organisation and its units must not collect money or material from those outside the membership. Fund collection is as much opposed to this movement as fire is to water. If you yield on this point, spiritual advance will perish. Let only members contribute; do not ask all and sundry, or anyone who is not a member of the Samithi (unit).”

3. The Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations cannot associate itself or partner with any other organisation be it religious or spiritual or of any nature or any institution or body or association





of persons whether registered or unregistered of any nature in carrying out or execution of its activities.

4. The organisation does not strive for proliferation or publicity or propaganda of its work, activities or achievements nor does it indulge in any kind of fanfare or exhibitionism or pomp or show in carrying out any activities as these are alien to the spiritual path.

“The Units of our Organisation should not encourage pomp or show for they are alien to the Spiritual Path.”

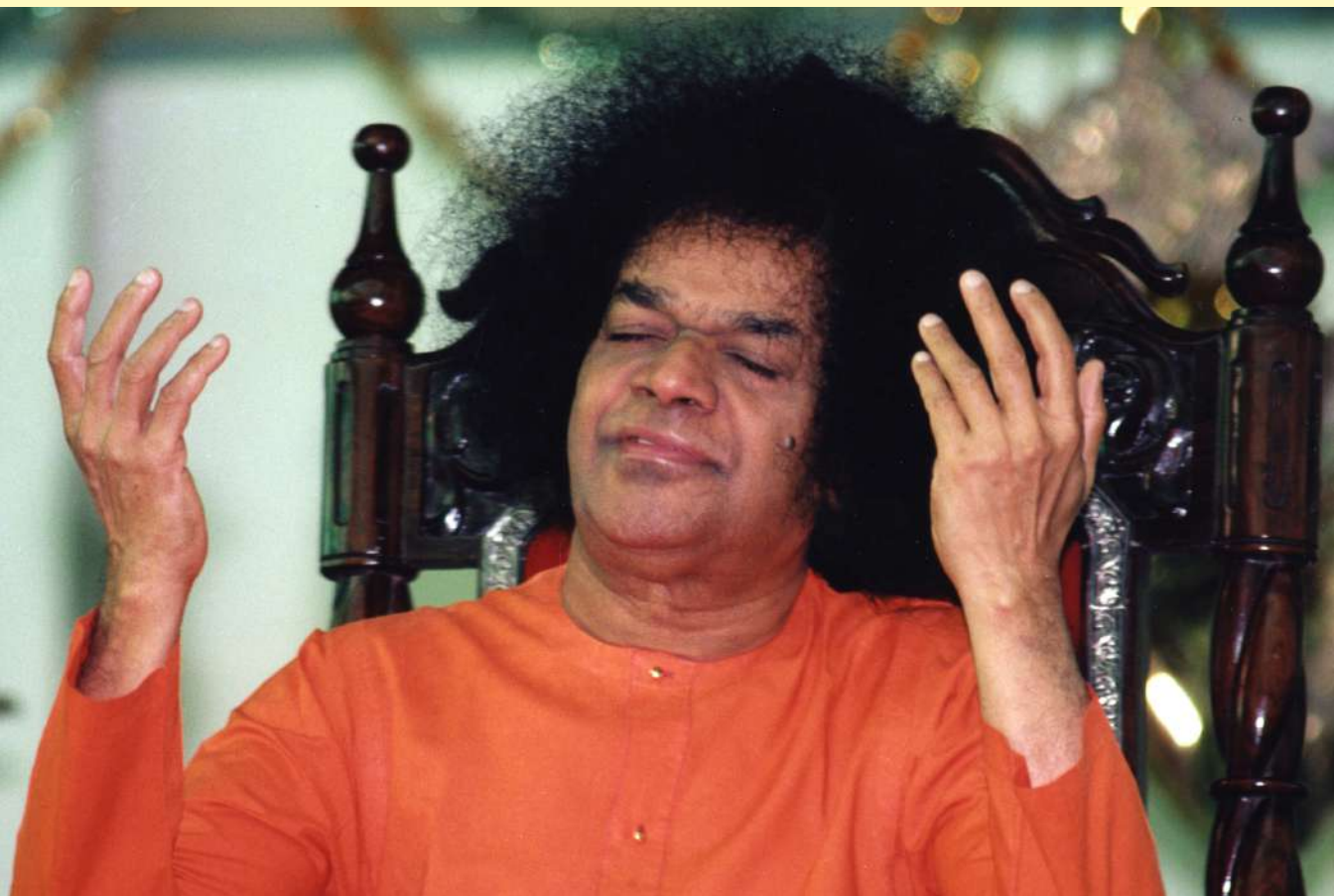

5. The organisation shall:
- never have any connection with the government at any level
 - never seek any support or assistance or help from any government or corporate or non-corporate entity or any other agency or body in execution of or carrying out its activities.

“There are two main points for our Organisation to observe: First, do not become involved with money, government, or power. Second, do only what you can within your limits. Let the government take care of whatever it wants to take care of. Do not use its name to enter any

activities. Do only those things which you can do with your own resources and which are within your own capabilities.

When you follow these principles, even government with be helping you in your endeavours. However, do not establish any connection between the government and the Sai Organisation, in relation to service.”

6. Proper segregation and separation between male and female members of the organisation is always maintained while performing or executing any activity of the organisation. •



The Wings of the Organisation

Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations functions under three wings viz. (i) Spiritual, (ii) Education and (iii) Service. These symbolise Worship, Wisdom and Work respectively. Although the nature of activities undertaken under different wings appear to be distinct or dissimilar, yet there is an inherent interrelationship amongst all the three wings. Spirituality and Service are complementary to each other. Spirituality is the motivational force behind service and service is the fulfilment of spirituality. Therefore, spiritual knowledge must be skilled into wisdom and should be put into practice in the form of service to humanity in order to realise the ultimate objective for which the organisation has been established.

Thus, in order to successfully realise the purpose of joining the Sai Organisation, one must participate in activities of all the three wings.

Spiritual Wing

As the tree grows, the roots must also grow inwards. The growth of the tree is dependent on the roots inside the ground. Thus, the spiritual wing undertakes activities that are targeted to arouse inspiration and inward vision with a view to developing the urge to connect with the inner core and obtaining clarification to doubts or answers to questions related to spiritual progress of the member. It helps to nurture the inner self and awakening the inherent divinity.

The activities undertaken by the spiritual wing include the following:

- (i) Bhajans
- (ii) Nagarsankeertan
- (iii) Study circles

- (iii) parenting programmes targeted towards educating youngs parents on value based parenting in accordance with the teachings of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba

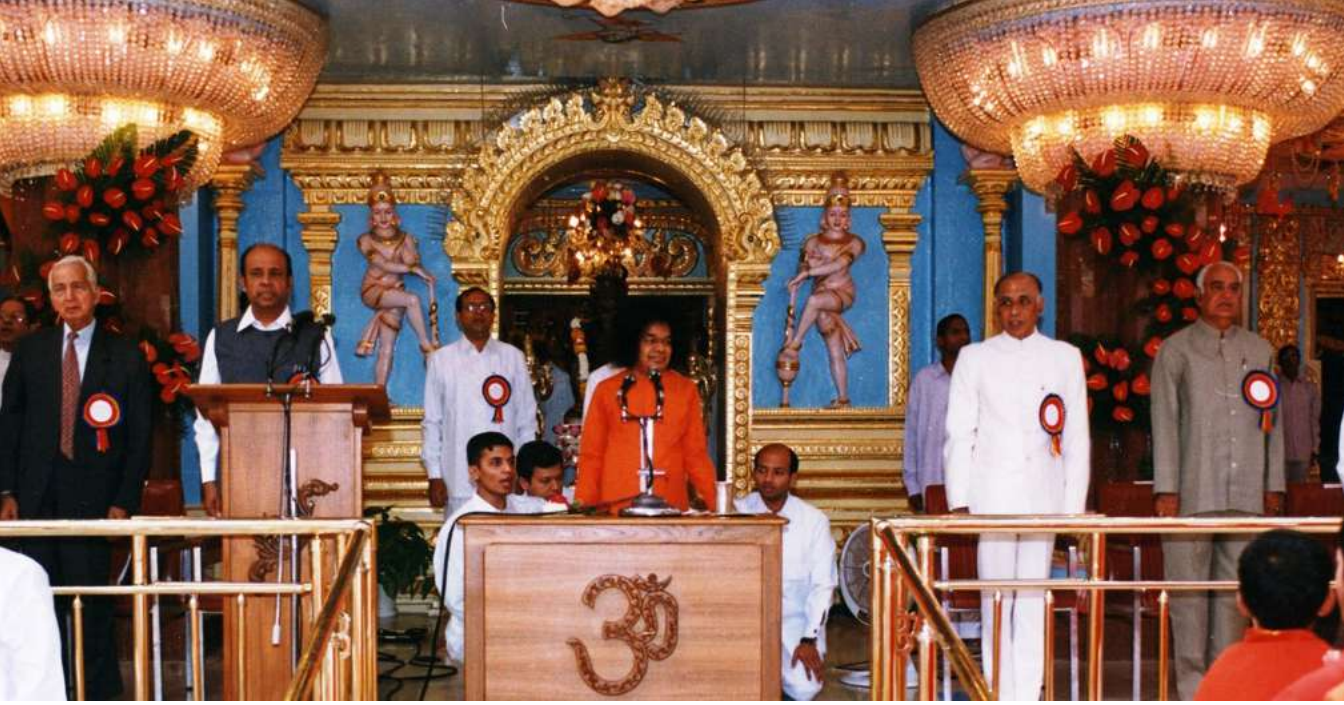
Service Wing

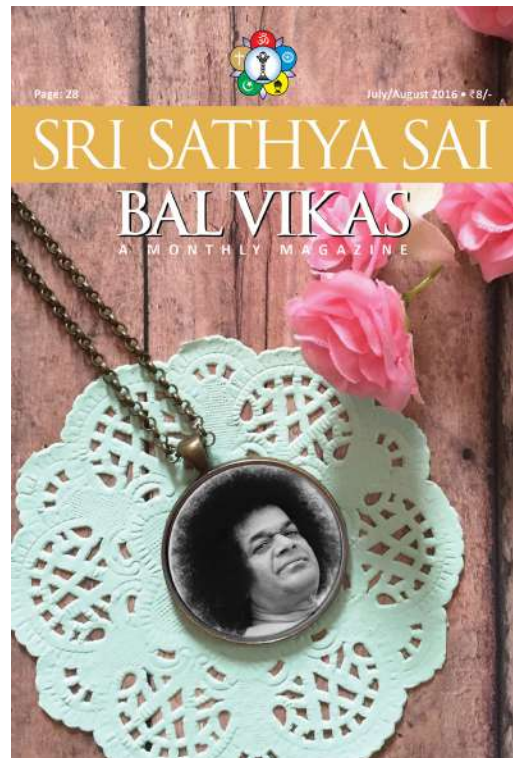
Sri Sathya Sai Bal Vikas - The Pathway to Righteousness -

One of the most important and integral activities of the Organisation is the Sri Sathya Sai Bal Vikas which is undertaken by the Education Wing.

Sri Sathya Sai Baba says, “True Education is not for mere living, but for a fuller and meaningful life” He further says, “Education is not acquisition of burdensome information regarding objects and men. It is the awareness of the immortal spirit within, which is the spring of joy, peace and courage.” He emphasises that True education does not mean imparting of bookish knowledge alone. It is a process of blossoming of human excellence which is reflected in form of character of the educated. Thus, character is the most precious gift of education and virtues alone reveal the outcome of true education. Unfortunately, modern education disregards this aspect of education and concentrates merely on the head of the pupil while forgetting the heart!

It is with this objective of inculcating values by cultivating the hearts of innocent

children that Sri Sathya Sai Baba started the Bal Vikas program, the ideal of which as proclaimed by Him is “to raise a generation of boys and girls who have a clean and





clear conscience”. Expounding the bigger motive behind the Bal Vikas, he declared that “the Bal Vikas is the primary basis of the great movement to restore dharma (righteousness) in the world. The elders are far gone in their ways, and it is difficult to expect change in their habits and attitudes. Children have to be led into good ways of living, into simplicity, humility and discipline.”

Sri Sathya Sai Bal Vikas classes are conducted in a non-formal environment by trained individuals who are normally referred as the Bal Vikas Gurus. These classes have the main objective of initiating the child into a course of character building by developing self-discipline, providing healthy association and inculcating the five basic human values of truth, righteousness,

peace, love and non-violence in children. The course is spread over a duration of nine years with three groups of three years each. The classes are generally held weekly for a duration of 60 to 90 minutes.

Sri Sathya Sai Baba also stated that the Bal Vikas is equally beneficial for the Guru as well. He said that “the Bal Vikas is devised not merely for the education of the children but also of the Gurus. The Bal Vikas chores are bound to elevate and sublimate the thoughts and emotions of the Gurus far better than any other saadhana (spiritual discipline) can. Remember that as Gurus, you too have a Guru guiding you and overseeing your seva (service). So you too are pupils, and you too learn the lessons of equality, equanimity and selfless love while acting as Gurus.” •

Membership

The membership of the Organisation is open to all irrespective of colour, caste, creed, religion or socio-economic status.

Any individual who fulfills the following criteria can become a member:

- (i) has attained the age of 18 years
- (ii) has faith in God
- (iii) is an eager spiritual aspirant
- (iv) has good character and has won recognition as good person
- (v) is willing to abide by the Nine-Point Code of Conduct and the Rules and Regulations of the Organisation in force from time to time
- (vi) is willing to participate in the activities of Organisation.

It is noteworthy that the membership of the organisation is not by any compulsion but is completely voluntary.

The following excerpts from the discourses of Sri Sathya Sai Baba warrant consideration for proper understanding that underlie the purpose of joining the Organisation:

“You join the Samithi, you share in its activities, for your own sake; not for the sake of Sathya Sai or the Samithi started in that name. If you feel that you can earn fame or name, or social status, or some other type of gain by entering this Organisation, there is no place for you in it. This is a place for Saadhana, constant, vigilant Saadhana (spiritual striving).”

The Emblem of the Organisation and its significance

“The symbol of the Organisation is the Harmony of Religions, the Unity of all Faiths, the Acceptance of all Approaches.”

- Divine Discourse, Madras, 23 December 1971

The emblem of the Organisation is known as the ‘Sarva Dharma Logo’ which represents the unity of all faiths and progressions to spiritual realisation. It enshrines, in the five semicircles around the centre circle, the symbols of five major religions of the mankind.

Significance of the Stupa in the centre

Inside the main circle, in the centre is the “stupa” (pillar) with concentric rings holding a lotus flower on its top on which is the illuminating flame.

The pillar represents Yoga, with a number of rings to indicate the stages of Yogic Sadhana. This Yoga leads to the unfolding of the Lotus of the Heart, whose petals are borne on top of the pillar. The next stage of this consummation of Bhakthi and the blossoming of the Heart

is the Flame of Jnana, the Illumination, the Jyothi, which is symbolised as the finale of the Sthambha (pillar). The Yoga fructifies and takes the sadhaka (spiritual aspirant) on from one height to another, until the Lotus of the Heart blooms and the Effulgence of Illumination is vouchsafed at last.

Significance of religious symbols

The significance of the sacred symbols of various religions have been explained by Baba so that we can understand the truth that all religions lead man on the path to the same God.

Hinduism

“Listen to the primeval Pranava ‘AUM’ resounding in your heart as well as in the heart of the universe.”





Buddhism

“Remember the wheel of cause and consequence, of deed and destiny and the wheel of Dharma that guides them all.”

Zoroastrianism

“Offer all bitterness in the sacred fire and emerge grand, great and godly.”

Islam

“Be like the star which never wavers from the crescent, but is fixed in steady faith.”

Christianity

“Cut the ‘I’ feeling clean across and let our ego die on the cross, to endow on you eternity.”

Sri Sathya Sai Baba proclaimed, “I have come not to disturb or destroy any faith, but to confirm each in his own faith - so that the Christian becomes a better Christian, the Muslim, a better Muslim, and the Hindu, a better Hindu.” He has constantly reminded mankind about the unity of all faiths. The following excerpts from His discourses are panacea for the all problems for mankind today.

“I have come to light the lamp of love in your hearts, to see that it shines day by day with added lustre. I have not come to speak on behalf of any particular dharma (righteousness), like the Hindhu Dharma. I have not come on any mission of publicity for any sect or creed or cause; nor have I come to collect followers for any doctrine. I have no plan to attract disciples or devotees into My fold or any fold. I have come to tell you of this Universal unitary faith, this Aathmic principle, this path of love, this dharma of prema, this duty of love, this obligation to love.”

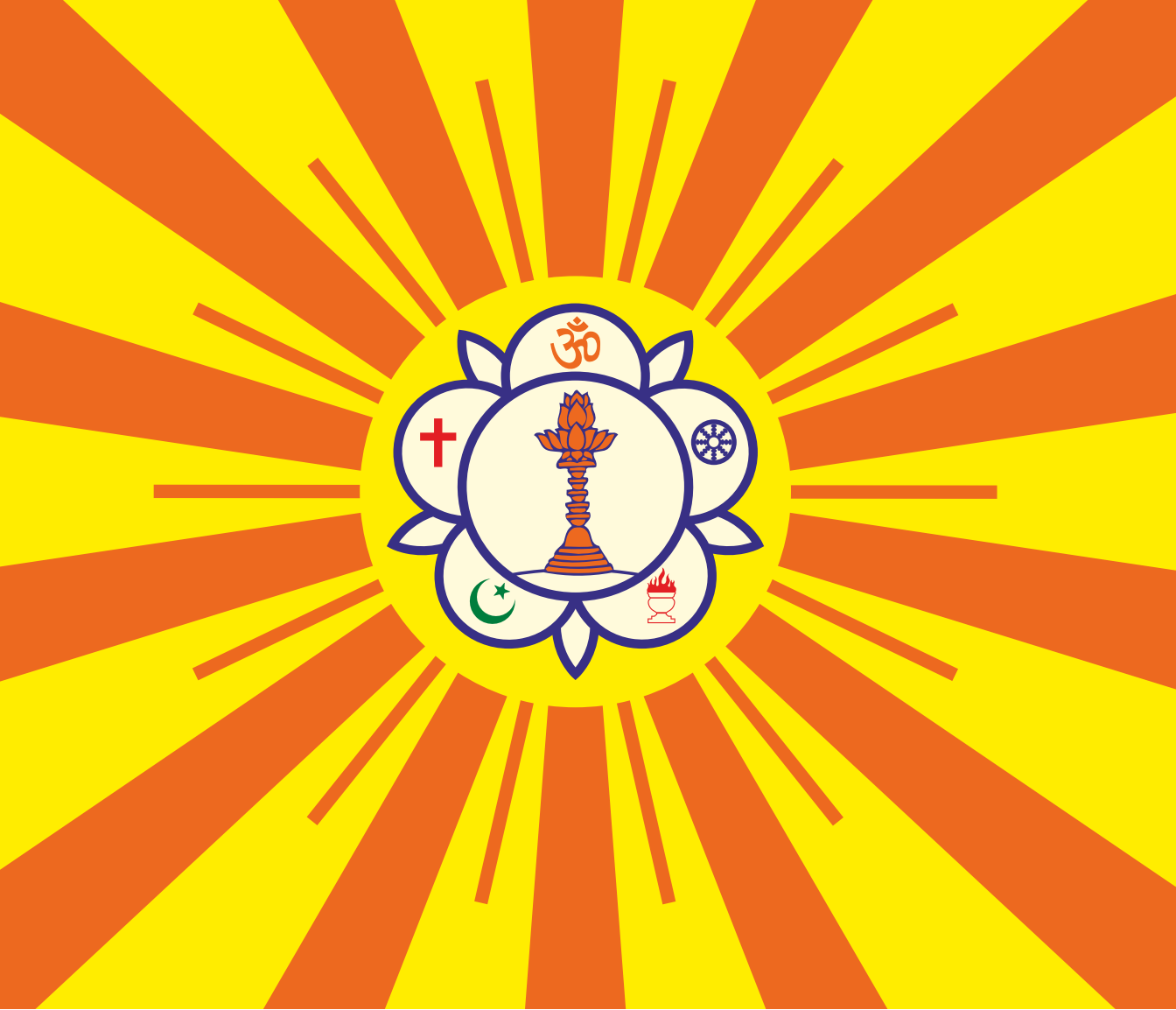

The Scarf & Badge and its Significance

The Scarf and Badge is the holy insignia of the organisation. It represents sacrifice and commitment of the members of the Organisation. All members should necessarily wear scarf and badge while undertaking service activities.

The Scarf (in a combination of light and dark blue for men and yellow and saffron for women has the Sarva Dharma Logo printed in the centre) and the Sevadal badge (a round medallion with the Sarva Dharma Logo and the dictum “Work is Worship” from Sri Sathya Sai Baba inscribed in it) carry a deep message. It signifies that for a member wearing the scarf and badge, adherence to one’s duty with steadfast commitment and dedication is in true sense the worshipping of God.

The following excerpts from the discourses of Sri Sathya Sai Baba underscore

the significance and import of the Scarf and Badge.

“The Sevadal badge you wear is not a decoration item which can be secured without a price. It is a symbol of high character, generous feelings and steady and sincere endeavour. It is the external indicator of internal enthusiasm and strength, skill and faith. As iron is drawn by the magnet, and when you allow these qualities to shine through you, it will draw the dejected, the downcast and the distressed towards you. If you are proud and self-centred, blind to the kinship that binds all in fraternal love, the badge is a betrayal. Mere sentiment and empathy are of no use; they must be regulated by intelligence



and skill. It is not the quantity of service you do that matters; nor is the variety. It is the inner joy, the love that you radiate that is important.”

TELANGANA STATE PROFILE 2019

Telangana is the 29th state of India, formed on the 2nd of June 2014. The state has an area of 1,12,077 Sq. Km. and has a population of 3,50,03,674. The Telangana region was part of the Hyderabad state from Sept 17th 1948 to Nov 1st 1956, until it was merged with Andhra state to form the Andhra Pradesh state. After decades of movement for a separate State, Telangana was created by passing the AP State Reorganization Bill in both houses of Parliament. Telangana is surrounded by Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh in the North, Karnataka in the West and Andhra Pradesh in the South and East directions.

Telangana, as a geographical and political entity was born on June 2, 2014 as the 29th and the youngest state in Union of India. However, as an economic, social, cultural and historical entity it has a glorious history of at least two thousand five hundred years or more. Megalithic stone structures like cairns, cists, dolmens and menhirs found in several districts of Telangana show that there were human habitations in this part of the country thousands of years ago. Remnants of iron ore smelting found at many places demonstrate the hoary roots of artisanship and tool making in Telangana for at least two thousand years. The reference to Asmaka Janapada, part of present Telangana, as one of the 16 Janapadas in ancient India proves that there existed an advanced stage of society.

One of the first five disciples of the Buddha, Kondanna is a typical name from Telangana and though there is no exact information about his native place, the earliest known Buddhist township of Kondapur in Medak district is believed to be after him. The Buddha himself famously acknowledged that it was Kondanna who understood him properly. The Buddhist sources say that Bavari, a Brahmin from Badanakurti in Karimnagar sent his disciples to all the way to north India to learn Buddhism and spread the message in this region. Megasthenes, who visited India in the 4th century BCE, wrote that there were 30 fortified towns of Andhras and a majority of them were in Telangana. In the historical age, Telangana had given rise to mighty empires and kingdoms like the Satavahanas, Vakatakas, Ikshvakus, Vishnukundins, Chalukyas, Kakatias, Qutb Shahis and Asif Jahis.

The emergence and flourishing of these powerful political formations is in itself a proof of existence of a sturdy economic, social and cultural structure. Thus Telangana has been a vibrant social entity by the time of the Buddha and continued to be so for the next two and a half millennia.. Telangana rose again and secured its political identity now and is in the process of resurrecting its own glorious past.

The Telangana government has announced the following icons for the new State:

- **The State Language** – Telugu దేశ భాషలందు తెలుగు లొస్సు
- **The State Bird** - Palapitta (Indian Roller or Blue Jay) *Coracias benghalensis*



Lord Rama spotted the Palapitta before invading Lanka and vanquished Ravana. Palapitta has been chosen to put Telangana on the path of victory

- **The State Animal** - Jinka (Deer) *Axis*



Deer is deeply associated with Indian history and a reference to this graceful animal was there in the great epic Ramayana. It can survive in the smallest forests also.

It reflects the mindset of the people of Telangana as it is very sensitive and innocent

- **The State Tree** - Jammi Chettu (*Prosopis Cineraria*).



Pandavas had vanquished a large army of Kauravas only after performing worshipping the Jammi Chettu. They had hidden their weapons on a Jammi Chettu when they had been forced into exile in the forests.

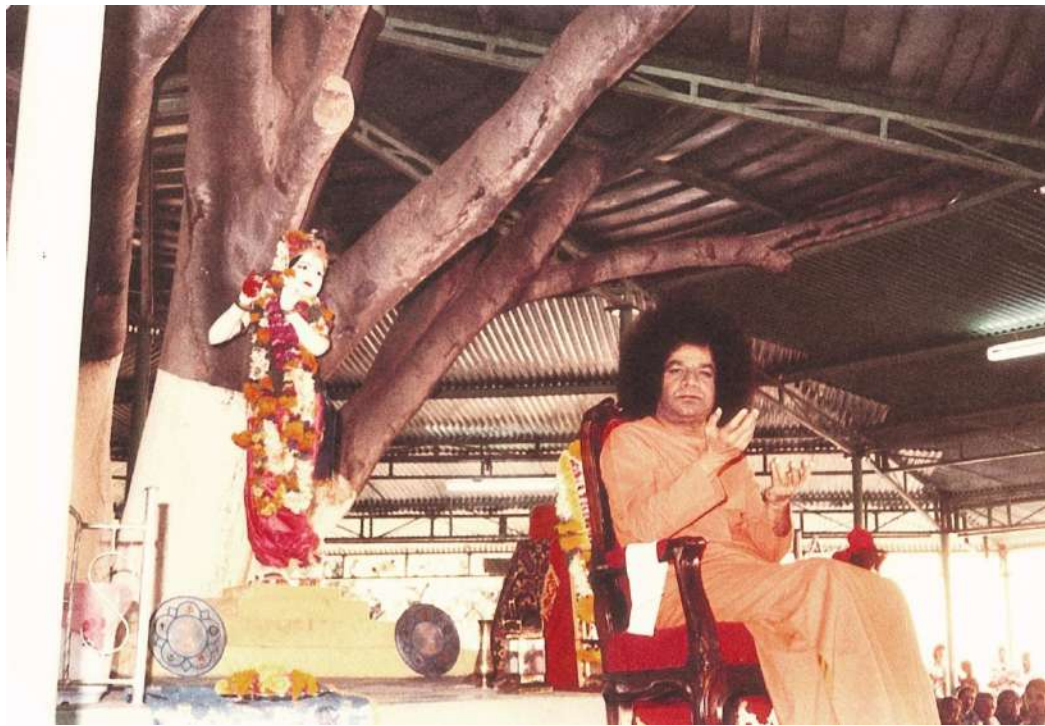

Summary

Integrated Tribal Development program was initiated way back in 2013 in Telangana at Chennaram cluster of Nagerkurnool dt.

There after the project got re designated under the title SAI JANANI, and extended in various quarters of Telangana state in 2018.

So far 76 health camps were conducted in Chennaram cluster, which is coming under ITDA Mannanur, catering to the medical needs of more than 23,000 patients coming from 40 villages in the tribal belt of Nagarkurnool district.

Nearly 1750 patients were given Spectacles , 650 patients got operated for Cataract , 70 got their Dental problems cleared and nearly 2000 patients underwent blood tests.

In other tribal areas like Sai Janani -2 Bhadrachalam , 3 Utnoor & 4th at Eturnagaram various developmental & spiritual activities like Balvikas, Medicare , Socio care , Vocational training camps, Sathya Sai Vratams, Bhajans , Narayan seva & Palanquin processions are already in place.

Similar development projects, under Sai Janani, were also extended to 5th ST habitations in Plain areas of Hyderabad , Rangareddy, Medchal, Sangareddy & Siddipet districts with a special emphasis on Sociocare, Agricare & Medicare programs.

Follow up cases are taken up by well experienced sevadal and the medical issue , which has been longstanding for the tribal house hold , is brought to a logical conclusion by Swami's grace and to the great relief of the tribal village.

Utnoor is a village and a [Mandal](#) in [Adilabad district](#) in the state of Telangana in [India](#).

It is known for the **NEOLITHIC EXCAVATIONS**.

It is located about 55 km from district headquarter Adilabad and on the way to Adilabad-Karimnagar highway. It is a Tribal agency Area inhabited by Tribal People.

Utnoor town in Adilabad district. Utnur is Mandal HQ (mdl code-26) in Adilabad Dt, Telangana. There are 39 villages under this mandal and the villages are : 1 Chintakarra, 2 Narsapur (buzurg), 3 Ghatti, 4 Wadoni, 5 Chandur, 6 Hasnapur, 7 Yenka, 8 Umri, 9 Narsapur (khurd), 10 Sakhera, 11 Andholi, 12 Pulimadgu, 13 Yenda, 14 Shampur, 15 Salewada (buzurg), 16 Salewada (khurd), 17 Kopergadh, 18 wadgalpur (khurd), 19 wadgalpur (buzurg), 20 Tandra, 21 Luxettipet, 22 Nagapur, 23 Heerapur – j, 24 Ramlingampet, 25 Durgapur, 26 Rampur (khurd), 27 Lakkaram, 28 Gangamapet, 29 Utnur, 30 Gangapur, 31 Kamnipet, 32 Heerapur, 33 Tejapur – j, 34 Danthanpalle, 35 Ghanpur, 36 Narsapur (new), 37 Bhupet, 38 Balampur, 39 Birsaipect.

Utnoor is 56 km from Adilabad. The town is famous for a temple called Ramalayam, dedicated to Lord Ram. The village folk in the forest areas of Utnoor specialize in a dance form called Mathuri which is played during Gokul Ashtami. About 25 km from Utnoor is the Keslapur town, well-known for the Nagoba Temple. The nearest airport is at Hyderabad, 280 km from Adilabad.

Utnoor is a Town in Utnoor Mandal , Adilabad District , Telangana State . Utnoor is 42 km far from its District Main City Adilabad . It is 223 km far from its State Main City Hyderabad Nearest Towns are Jainoor(14.3 k.m.) ,Narnoor(16.9 k.m.) ,Indervelly(16.9 k.m.) ,Sirpur (U)(18.6 k.m.) , Birsaipect , Danthanpalle , Ghanpur , Hasnapur , Lakkaram , Luxettipet , are the villages along with this village in the same Utnoor Mandal. There is a Rajgond Fort near the Kumram Bheemu Complex where the Project Monitoring Resource Centre (PMRC) and its Guest house are situated.

The Gonds worship Persa Pen, whose symbols are a piece of cloth, black hair from the tail of a cow and a stick. Kolams worship Bheem ayyak, whose symbols are Peacock feathers in a wooden holder with figures of Sun, Moon, horse carved upon it.

Warangal district lies between the latitude of 17° 0' – 19° 0' and 18° 0' – 36° 0'. North and longitudes of 78° 0' – 79° 0' and 48° 0' – 49° 0' with Nalgonda District in the South, Medak District in West, Karimnagar District in North, and Khammam District in the East. The District spread over an area of 12846 Sq.KMs. This Agency is a society Registered under the Societies Registration act –XXI of 1869 and started functioning from 29-02-1975. In the year 1986 it was shifted from Warangal to Akulavari Ghanpur, Eturnagaram. Koyas, Nayakpods, constitute the aboriginal tribes of this area. The Lambadas & Erukalas were declared as Scheduled Tribe in 1977. The tribal population of the district according to 2011 census is 5.305 Lakhs. The percentage of ST population against the total population of the district is 15.103%.

A little festival of tribal origin in Telangana has become a major pilgrimage in the last six years. The Medaram Jathara festival is held every two years at in Medaram Village of Tadvai Mandal deep in the heart of the thick forests of Jayashankar Bhupalpally district.

This Jathara has been declared as State Festival during 1998. This year the Jathara will be held from 5th February to 8th February 2020 (4-days)

The population of the little forest village at Medaram in normal times never exceeds 300. Suddenly, Last year nearly 1 crore pilgrims participated in the Jathara and during this year the expected pilgrims is 1.20 crore devotees come from all over Telangana, Andhra and neighbouring states like Orissa, Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh

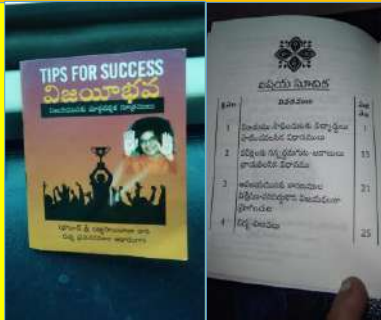

Dr. N. Sivakumar is the speaker for the day.

Dr. N. Sivakumar belongs to a family of long standing devotees and currently resides in Bangalore. He joined the Divyana Campus of Dowry's College in 1982 for his Pre-University Course (i.e. 11th & 12th Standards), at which he obtained a state rank. He subsequently did his Bachelor's Course (B.Com) and Masters in Business Administration (MBA) from Sri Satya Sai Institute of Higher Learning. He was awarded the "Sri Satya Sai AB Research" Award in 1987 and also received the Gold Medal for Academic Excellence in MBA in 1989.

Dr. N. Sivakumar was also the first Ph.D candidate in the Department of Management and was blessed with Ph.D degree in 1995. After his MBA, **SWAMI** blessed him with an opportunity to work in HIS college, initially as Principal, Subsequent Campus and later at Divyana Campus.
